
INTRODUCTION

• Republicanism and Protestantism - ""The "two horns like a lamb" well represent the character of our own Government, as expressed in its two fundamental principles,--Republicanism and Protestantism. These principles are the secret of our power and prosperity as a nation... They determined to establish a government upon the broad foundation of civil and religious liberty" {ST, February 8, 1910 }

• Great Truth - Their[Christian Exiles] views found place in the Declaration of Independence, which sets forth the great truth that "all men are created equal" and endowed with the inalienable right to "life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness." And the Constitution guarantees to the people the right of selfgovernment, providing that representatives elected by the popular vote shall enact and administer the laws. Freedom of religious faith was also granted, every man being permitted to worship God according to the dictates of his conscience. {Great Controversy 441.1}



- JS: When you say `Blue Laws,' you think about store closings, Sunday closing laws, and those are certainly part of what I'm talking about, but I'm talking about the right to protect social time, the right to protect time when families get together and communities get together, the right to create some fence around social time. That's something we need to think about in our society because we're on the verge of losing that. People used to be on the same schedule and that is no longer true.

- 3.) JG: That's the beauty of living in Jerusalem, because the enforcement of Shabbat laws helps create a common experience.
- JS: It gives you permission to stop. I myself am very obsessive-compulsive. I have a very hard time stopping, and I need social pressure and moral reinforcement to feel okay stopping. There's something to be said for having the world stop around you. How exactly you achieve that in America is very tough. It's very tough to enforce in our society. But it's very important to become more sabbatarian, to become more conscious of protecting workers' time in general, social time, weekend time, finding a way through incentives on taxation to encourage employers not to employ people at that time.

- "The demands of work can't bully people out of needed time off"
- "Sunday must be a day of rest for everyone, so people can be free to be with their families and with God"
- "By defending Sunday, one defends human freedom,"
- Sunday is the day of the Lord and of man, a day which everyone must be able to be free — free for the family and free for God."
- Family, work, rest and celebration are gifts from God and important aspects of human life that must find a "harmonious balance" in order to build a more humane world.





POPE FRANCIS New York Times, Apr 26, 2013 "Together with a culture of work, there must be a culture of leisure as gratification. To put it another way: people who work must take the time to relax, to be with their families, to enjoy themselves, read, listen to music, play a sport. But this is being destroyed, in large part, by the elimination of the Sabbath rest day. More and more people work on Sundays as a consequence of the competitiveness imposed by a consumer society....work ends up dehumanizing people."



POPE FRANCIS New York Times, Apr 26, 2013 Catholic Catechism teaches (Paragraph 2185), "On Sundays and other holy days of obligation, the faithful are to refrain from engaging in work or activities that hinder the worship owed to God, the joy proper to the Lord's Day, the performance of the works of mercy, and the appropriate relaxation of mind and body."

Oct 2012 - 250 Bishops of Rome "Even though there is a tension between the Christian Sunday and the secular Sunday, Sunday needs to be recovered" — in keeping, they wrote, with John Paul's [II]
"Dies Domini."




- Now we have the distraction of unnecessary shopping; in the not-too-distant past, nonessential business establishments were required to be closed on Sundays.
